INDEPENDENCE DAY

The legal separation of the American colonies from Great Britain was passed on July 2, 1776, and is celebrated on the 4th of July each year.

The Declaration of Independence is a statement explaining this decision of congress; that was prepared by a committee with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author.

Congress debated and revised the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4th. We as a nation have celebrated this act ever since with fireworks, picnics, BBQ's, parades, political speeches and patriotic songs.

John Adams wrote this note to his wife Abigail:

The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. **It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty.** It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more.

Even though he was just a few days off on his calculation he understood the power behind this document and predicted our modern day celebrations. Our founding fathers deemed it of the utmost importance to provide for all the people of the United States the right to serve God freely and openly.

We begin our public celebrations with the pledge of allegiance to

our countries flag.



I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

Within this pledge we acknowledge that we are a nation under God. Having the right to serve Him if we choose. We are very blessed to have this right. Below I have included the pledge for the Christian flag, the Bible and the Cross.

Christian Flag Pledge

"I pledge allegiance to the Christian flag, and to the Savior for whose kingdom it stands; one Savior, crucified, risen, and coming again with life and liberty to all who believe."



Bible Pledge

"I pledge allegiance to the Bible, God's Holy Word. I will make it a light unto my path and a lamp unto my feet and will hide its Word's in my heart that I might not sin against God.

Cross Pledge

I pledge allegiance to the cross of my Lord, Jesus Christ, and to the faith for which it stands ... one Savior, eternal with mercy and grace for all.
